- If you scored **less than** a 550 SAT or 22 ACT score, you **MUST TAKE THE MATH PLACEMENT TEST**. (Exception: You **DO NOT** need to take the Math Placement test if Appalachian is awarding you 3+ hours of college-level transfer math credits. If you have transfer credit for MAT 1025 and you are majoring in Math/Science/or Computer Science, you can register directly for MAT 1110 without the Calculus Readiness Test.)
- If you need calculus for your major OR plan on taking MAT 1110 (CALCULUS I), **YOU MUST TAKE THE CALCULUS READINESS TEST**. [Exception: You do not need the Calculus Readiness Test is you have AP, IB, or transfer credit for MAT 1110.](#) If you have transfer credit for MAT 1025 and you are majoring in Math/Science/or Computer Science, you should be able to register directly for MAT 1110 without the Calculus Readiness Test.

*If the SAT was taken prior to March 2016, students need an SAT MAT score of 520 or higher to exempt the Math Placement test. Students who took the SAT from March 2016 forward need an SAT MAT score of 550 or higher in order to exempt the MAT Placement test.
